

Dress Code – BayView State School

Student dress standards promote the good image of our school and encourage students to uphold and enhance that image. Our Dress Code enables students to participate fully in all school activities and contributes to, and supports, a healthy and safe learning environment in compliance with the *Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 (Qld)*. Our uniforms reflect current recommended Departmental Sun Safety material and style.

It is expected that parents will support the uniform policy by ensuring students arrive at school in full school uniform each day. It is a condition of enrolment that students comply with the Dress Code. The uniform must be in good condition and clean. All items should be named. Uniforms are available for interim use for those students who are unable to meet uniform requirements. BayView State School is an inclusive school which values diversity and works with families to accommodate uniform variations to meet cultural and religious customs.

Uniform (all year levels)

School designed polo shirt (available at school). School approved navy shorts or navy skorts (available at school). Shorts with pockets on the outside and cargo shorts are NOT approved.

Cool weather options

School designed winter Tracksuit top is encouraged. A plain navy jumper is also acceptable. School designed Navy Tracksuit pants or Navy Leggings/stockings covering the feet. Other items including beanies, scarves and gloves may be worn to and from school, however due to safety and operational constraints they are not to be worn in school.

Shoes

Black fully enclosed lace up shoes. (Most students will wear sports shoes), shoes are not to have any other colours on them.

Hats

Students are required to wear the school approved navy wide brim hat whenever they are outside. Non-school hats should not be brought to school.

Jewellery

Students are permitted to wear one set of earrings, preferably studs or sleepers. Additional earrings are not permitted at school. Other visible body piercings are not permitted at school. Students may wear a single signet ring with a smooth surface.

Students may wear an appropriate watch that does not disrupt the learning of the class. All Smart Watches must be disconnected/disabled when at school. Students are not permitted to wear any form of necklace, bracelet or anklet, except for Medical Alert Identification or for cultural or religious reasons approved by the year level Deputy Principal. As per Department of Education and Training policy for Sport, all jewellery must be removed prior to participation in organised competitive sport.



Hair

Hair that touches or is below the collar must be tied back at all times. Extremes of hairstyle such as ridges, tracks, shaved styles (hair must be at least a three blade), spikes, rats tails, undercuts, top-knots, mohawks, mullets or similar extreme styles are not acceptable at this school. Hair must be a natural colour.

Nails

Nail polish, French tips, nail embellishments or artificial nails are not to be worn.

Dress Code expectations:

Our students are required to:

- o wear the agreed school uniform on a daily basis;
- be of neat and tidy appearance at all times, including retaining hair that is below collar or eyebrow length in a single pony tail or dual pig-tails using a school colour hair band or ribbon;
- wear enclosed shoes as per the Dress Code;
- wear the school approved wide brimmed hat while engaged in outdoor activities; and
- o wear only the approved full school uniform when representing our school in community activities.
- School Back Pack, printed with the school logo (encouraged) (available at school).

Consequences for not abiding by the School's Dress Code may include:

- o Imposing a detention for a student during lunch break
- Preventing student from attending, or participating in, any activity for which student is representing school; including Excursions, Sport and Camp or
- Preventing student from attending or participating in any school activity that is not an essential school educational program, including the BayView Values Awards Program.
